- Dusting: Dust regularly with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth (like microfiber) to prevent the buildup of abrasive particles.
- Cleaning: For general cleaning, a cloth slightly dampened with water is usually sufficient. Wipe in the direction of the grain, then immediately follow with a dry cloth to remove any moisture.

Protecting the Finish

Most White Oak is sealed with a protective finish (like polyurethane or lacquer) that provides the primary defense against damage. Your job is to care for this finish.

- Gentle Cleaning: For sticky spots, use a wood-safe cleaner or a solution of mild soap and water. Apply it to your cloth, not directly to the wood. Clean the spot gently, rinse with a water-dampened cloth, and dry thoroughly.
- Avoid Wax Buildup: Unlike some other woods, most modern White Oak finishes do
 not require regular polishing or waxing. In fact, using waxes can cause a cloudy
 buildup over time that dulls the natural beauty of the wood.

Critical Mistakes to Avoid with White Oak

- Never Use Excessive Water: Standing water can seep into the grain and damage the wood and its finish. Clean up all spills immediately.
- Avoid Harsh Cleaners: Never use vinegar, ammonia-based cleaners, or abrasive scouring powders, as they can strip, scratch, or dull the protective finish.

 Prevent Scratches: Use felt pads under all furniture legs and decorative items. Be mindful of dragging heavy or sharp objects across the surface.
