The Foundation: Routine Care

- Dusting: Dust regularly with a soft, lint-free cloth (like microfiber). Always wipe in the
 direction of the grain to avoid fine scratches. Avoid feather dusters, which can have sharp
 quills.
- Cleaning Spills: Accidents happen. The key is to act immediately. Blot spills with a clean, absorbent cloth. Do not wipe, as this can spread the liquid. For sticky spots, use a cloth slightly dampened with water and a drop of mild soap, then immediately wipe dry with a separate clean cloth.

Enhancing the Lustre: Polishing

To maintain walnut's deep, rich glow, occasional polishing is recommended.

- Less is More: This is not a weekly task. Polishing every few months is usually sufficient.
- Choose the Right Product: Use a high-quality furniture polish or wax specifically designed for wood. Avoid all-purpose cleaners or sprays containing silicone or ammonia, as they can damage the finish over time.
- **Application:** Apply a small amount of polish to a clean, soft cloth and work it into the wood in the direction of the grain. Buff gently with a second clean cloth to a beautiful sheen.

Critical Mistakes to Avoid with Interior Hardwoods

Never Use Excessive Water: Water is the enemy of fine wood finishes. Never soak the
wood or leave wet items sitting on the surface.

- Avoid Direct Sunlight: Prolonged exposure to direct sunlight can cause the rich, dark color
 of walnut to fade over time. Position furniture away from windows where possible, or use
 curtains.
- Protect from Scratches and Heat: Always use coasters for drinks, placemats for dining, and felt pads under any objects placed on the surface to prevent scratches and heat rings.
